3rd week:Feb 3 - 7, 2019

Topics: Axilla.

A pyramidal-shaped passageway for vessels and nerves between upper limb and the root of the neck.

Has apex, base, 4 walls and contents.

- A. Apex \rightarrow (borders).
- B. Base \rightarrow (borders).
- C. Anterior wall. \rightarrow (Contents= 3M \rightarrow P. major, P. minor and Subclavius).
- D. Posterior wall. (Contents= 3M→Subscapularis, Latissmus dorsi and T. major).
- E. Medial wall →Serratus anterior, upper 4 ribs and their spaces.
- F. Contents:
 - Axillary artery. → (Beginning, End, Divisions and Branches).
 - 2. Axillary vein. → (Beginning, End and Tributary →Cephalic vein).
 - Axillary sheath. → (Description and Contents).
 - Axillary lymph nodes. → (Groups, Locations and Regions receive lymph from).
 - 5. Axillary fat.
 - 6. Brachial plexus

Parts:

- <u>5 Roots</u>: →Ventral rami (anterior limbs) of C5-T1 Mixed spinal nerves.
- 3 Trunks:
 - A- Upper Trunk →Union of ventral rami of C5+C6 nerves.
 - B- Middle Trunk →Ventral ramus (limb) of C7 nerve.
 - C- Lower Trunk →Union of ventral rami of C8+T1 nerves.
- **■** Divisions:
 - A- 3 Anterior divisions →for Flexor muscles.
 - B- 3 Posterior divisions → for Extensor muscles.
- 3 Cords:

Cords are named according to their relation to the 2nd part of the axillary artery.

- Posterior divisions of the 3 trunks unite to give→ Posterior cord.
- Anterior divisions of Upper trunk and Middle trunks unite→ Lateral cord.
- Anterior division of the lower trunk continues as →Medial cord.
- Terminal branches:
 - A- From roots:
 - 1- C5 → Dorsal scapular N. → 2Rhomboids, Levator scapulae Ms.
 - 2- C5, C6 and C7 →Long thoracic nerve →Serratus anterior muscle.
 - B- From upper trunk: -Nerve to subclavius→ C5 and C6.
 - Suprascapular n. →Supraspinatus and Infraspinatus Ms.
 - C- From cords:
 - 1- Posterior cord → 5 branches.
 - 2- Lateral cord → 3 branches.
 - 3- Medial cord→ 5 branches.

Topics: Pectoral and Scapular regions.

A. Pectoral region:

- Skin
 - Superficial fascia (Breast).
 - Deep fascia.
 - 1- Pectoralis major muscle [Origin, Insertion, Nerve Supply and Action].
 - 2- Pectoralis minor muscle [Origin, Insertion, Nerve Supply and Action].
 - 3- Subclavius muscle [Origin, Insertion, Nerve Supply and Action].
 - 4- Clavipectoral fascia (Location only).

B.Scapular muscles.

- 1. Trapezius muscle (Only: Identify + Nerve supply)
- 2. Deltoid muscle [Origin, Insertion, Nerve Supply and Action].
- 3. Supraspinatus muscle
- 4. Infraspinatus muscle
- 5. Teres minor muscle
- 6. Teres major muscle
- 7. Latissmus dorsi muscle (Only: Identify+ Insertion+ Nerve Supply + Action)
- 8. Serratus anterior muscle
- 9. Subscapularis muscle
